1st Reading: **Genesis 14.18-20:** Giving and receiving hospitality, sharing a meal together, is one of the constant features of the Scriptures. Here Abraham, a nomad and stranger, eats and drinks with the great king of Salem.

Response to the Psalm: You are a priest for ever, a priest like Melchizedek of old.

2nd Reading: I Corinthians 11.23-**16:** Like every generation of Christians, Paul hands on what he remains in me and I in received. Here, it is his experience of the Eucharist. He emphasises that it both looks back to what Christ has done and looks forward to when Christ will come again.

Alleluia! Alleluia! I am the living bread which has come down from heaven, says the lord. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Luke 9.11-17: The miracle of the loaves and fishes. Luke contrasts the welcome Jesus gives to the people with the disciples' desire to turn them away; their feelings of inadequacy, with the power of the Lord. Jesus is portrayed as feeling comfortable in the midst of the crowd



while the disciples feel lonely. The Lord sees possibilities while they see obstacles. From his abundance everyone receives.
