1st Reading: **II Samuel 5.1-3:** The tribes of Israel gather to proclaim David king, and to acknowledge him as the one appointed by God to be shepherd of the people and leader of Israel.

Response to the Psalm: I rejoiced when I heard them say: 'Let us go to God's house.'

2nd Reading: Colossians 1.12-20: Christ is the first-born of all creation. Through him all things came to be and in him all things are held in unity. Everything is reconciled through him and for him; in him we have been taken out of the power of darkness and given a place in his kingdom. He is the head of the Church which is his body.

Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! Blessings on him who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessings on the coming kingdom of our father David! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Luke 23.35-43: As a record of the crime he committed in the eyes of the Romans, the inscription on the cross of Jesus read; "The king of the Jews." This blindness and injustice was compounded by the sarcastic jeering of the bystanders. At the end, it was only the criminal hanging beside him who recognised him for who he was—"Remember me when you come



into your kingdom." The kingship of Jesus cannot be understood in the terms of this world.
