This week we celebrate Sunday of the Word of God. This was instituted by Pope Francis so that we can treasure ever more fully the Scriptures given to us in the bible. The logo for the Sunday of the Word of God gives particular prominence to the theme of relationship: a strong bond between the wayfarers, in an intertwining of looks, gestures, steps and words. In light of the passage about the disciples of Emmaus, Jesus appears as the one who "drew near and went with" humanity (Lk 24:15), and "dwelt

among us" (Jn 1:14). In him "there is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus" (Gal 3:28). Familiarity with the Word of God arises from a relationship that comes from searching for the face of God in Sacred Scripture. The Bible is not there to give concepts but experiences, it does not just plunge us into a text, rather it opens us to meeting the Word of life decisive "for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work" (2Tm 3:16,17). The theme this year is "Remain in my Word." (John 8.31)

## WEEK OF PRAYER FOR WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY: This

Christian week especially Christians are Unity reminded of Jesus' prayer for his disciples that "they may be

one so that the world may believe" (see John 17.21). Hearts are touched and Christians come together to pray for their unity. The theme for this week is "You shall love the Lord your God ... and your neighbour as yourself.

SUNDAY TAKEAWAY: We wish to live unity, because we wish to follow Christ, to live His love, to benefit from the mystery of His being one with the Father, which is the essence of divine love. ... According to Jesus' priestly prayer, what we yearn for is unity in the love of the Father, which comes to us as a gift in Jesus Christ, love that also informs thought and doctrines. It is not enough to be in agreement in comprehension of the Gospel, but it is necessary that all believers are united to Christ and in Christ. It is our personal and community conversion, our gradual conformation to Him, our living increasingly in Him, that enables us to grown in communion between us. This is the soul that also supports sessions of study and every other type of effort to arrive at more closely aligned points of view. Keeping this clearly in mind, it is possible to unmask some false models of communion that in reality do not lead to unity but instead contradict its essence. Pope Francis
